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#### Come to the Play

#### Dress Code Reminders

Once in a while it doesn't hurt to review the school's dress code, and today we will be calling your attention to one of the statements in the code. It reads as follows: ***Clothing should be clean, hemmed, and in good repair (no holes of***

***any kind).*** Not all fashions are appropriate for school; in general, neatness and modesty should be the appropriate standard. Specifically, no halter tops, half shirts, muscle shirts, tank tops, mini-skirts, jams, or pointelle (see through, air-hole tops) should be worn. With the warmer weather on its way, we may be tempted to wear what we wear around the house or in the neighborhood after school or on the weekend.

We want to call your attention particularly to "no holes of any kind" in shirts and pants. Even those that are purchased with holes are not appropriate for school. We have also noticed children wearing flip flops or sandals when playing outside. While this is not addressed in the current dress code, they are not the best for outside play . . . particularly for running. If children come to school with footwear with open toes or heels, have them bring another pair to wear outside.

#### Alpha Building Will Be Locked

Just as the Omega Building is locked during the school day, so will Alpha be locked. We are not always at the desk in the office, and it is our intention to protect our students and staff as best as we can. A door bell has been installed outside the door. Give the button a push, and you will be welcomed into the building. We will be looking at alternate door security devices during the next few months.

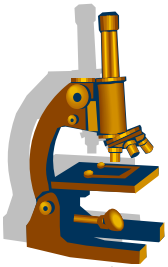
